ECONOMIC DISASTER RECOVERY WORK IN THE NAME OF JESUS CHRIST

Motown Mission Experience Trips engage people in economic disaster relief and recovery work in the City of Detroit. Participants serve God by serving others, explore the Biblical witness regarding the poor, meet the people and experience the culture of the Motor City, and discover their own capacity for living missionally in the name of Jesus Christ.

Quick Overview: Motown participants work in various neighborhoods to rebuild homes and tend Detroit's urban agriculture. No previous experience is necessary, but the skills of the participants will be considered and utilized.

- Leave Sunday afternoon, July 19 and return Saturday morning, July 25
- Ages 12 and up (*Families are encouraged to come together. Middle School students must be accompanied by one parent.*)
- Brief informational meeting on Sunday, April 26 after the service
- Cost—\$299 (**\$99 deposit due May 3**)
- 9am to 4pm work days can include construction, home repair, gardening, feeding
- Accommodations at the historic Metropolitan United Methodist Church in New Center neighborhood of Detroit
- Sleeping arrangements—men and women on separate floors with some bunk beds. Bring own bedding, air mattresses, fans for comfort
- Gluten free and dairy free menus available
- Evening activities include worship and devotions with visiting speakers or artists, sporting events, and trips around town
